POLICY FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF VACCINATION LAW NUMBER 25

National University College (NUC) aware of its responsibility to ensure that all students under age 21 are properly vaccinated, establishes the following policy for vaccination:

1. All NUC students up to twenty (20) years of age will have to show their original Vaccination Certificate at the time they are officially enrolled.
2. Students of all programs who at the time they are officially enrolled have yet to turn nineteen (19) years of age by a day and still are not due to receive one or more doses of the hepatitis vaccine, will be informed of their responsibility to transmit their corresponding vaccination through the **Certification of Orientation on Special Requirements of Academic Programs** delivered by the Admission's Officer and properly signed by him. This will form part of the student's academic record.
3. In the particular case of those students who enroll in a health program, when registering for a clinical course, regardless of age, they will have to meet the Hepatitis B (three 3) doses requirement, according to the correct order established by the Puerto Rico Health Department. If a student does not have the correct sequences of immunizations for the Hepatitis B vaccine, a serological test will have to be performed for antibodies against Hepatitis B. This will determine if the student has been vaccinated.

This policy is effective immediately.
