Guide to Complete the Student Loan Entrance Counseling Requirement

Financial Aid Office

This guide intends to assist any student who needs and decides to take federal loans to help cover educational expenses at the institution. If you are interested in receiving a subsidized or unsubsidized loan from the Direct Loan Program, you will be required to complete the entrance counseling. The objective of completing entrance counseling is to help you understand what it means to take out a federal student loan and you will learn about:

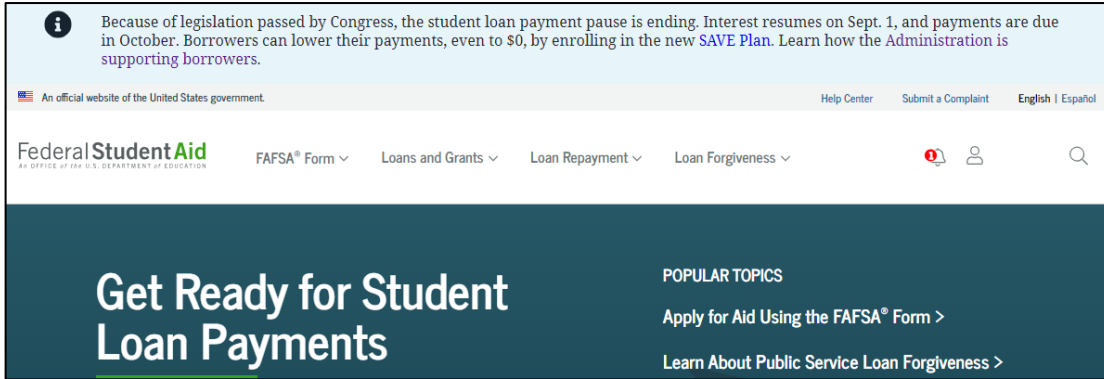
- What a Direct Loan is;
- How the loan process works;
- Terms and conditions of your loan;
- Rights and responsibilities that you have as a borrower
- How to avoid late payments and default
- Manage your education expenses;
- Other financial resources to consider to help pay for your education.

The process of completing the Entrance Counseling must be done in a single session and takes approximately 20 to 30 minutes. It is important that you have on hand:

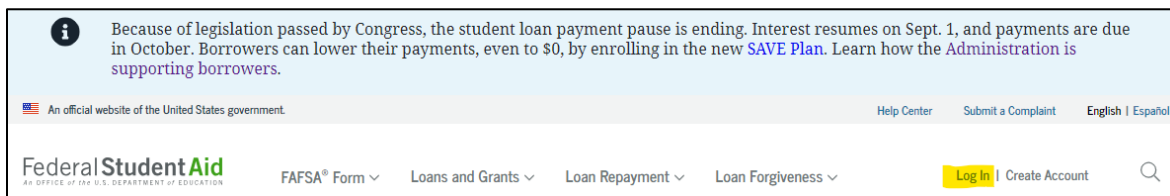
- Your FSA ID.
- School name.
- Details of your income, financial aid, and living expenses.

Step 1: Visit the following website: <https://studentaid.gov/>.



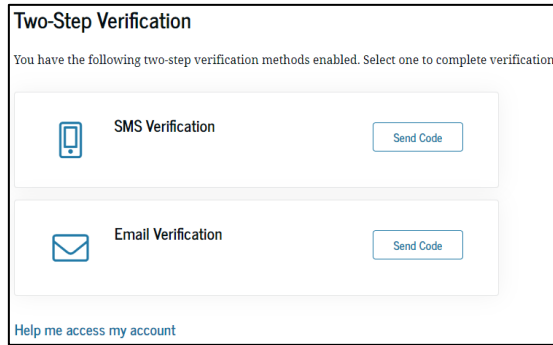
Step 2: Click on the **Log In** button



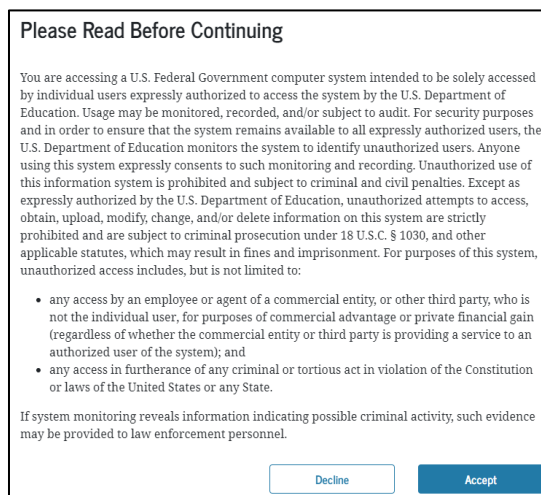
Step 3: If you do not have a FSA ID, click on the "Create an Account" option. If you already have an FSA ID proceed to enter the username and password, then click the option "Log in".

Step 4: You will need to perform two-step verification. Select the preferred method.

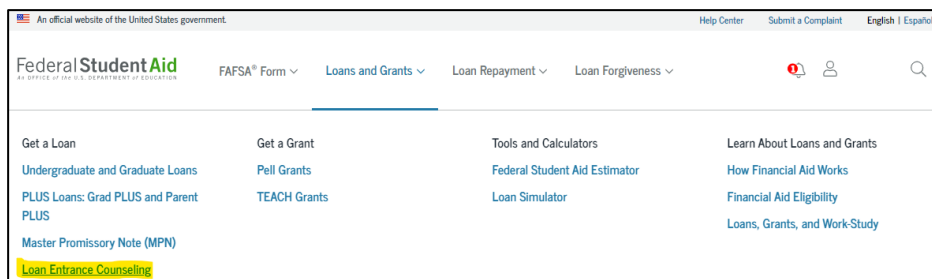


Step 5: Read and reject or accept to continue with the process.



Step 6: Confirm your information and accept the terms and conditions to continue with the process.

Step 7: In the top menu, select Loans and Grants and choose the option **Loan Entrance Counseling**.



Step 8: Select your student status to complete the Entrance Counseling. Click **Start**.

- Undergraduate student = select if you are enrolled in a Diploma, Associate or Bachelor's Degree
- Graduate student = select if you are enrolled in a Master's or Doctoral Degree

Your school may have different entrance counseling requirements. Check with your school's financial aid office to be sure that the counseling on this Web site satisfies your school's entrance counseling requirements.

Step 9: Read general information and click on **Continue**.

Entrance Counseling is required for students who have not previously received a subsidized/unsubsidized loan or PLUS loan (graduate/professional students only) under the Direct Loan Program ⓘ or Federal Family Education Loan (FFEL) Program ⓘ.

What You'll Learn and Do in Entrance Counseling

- Notify Your School**
Select the school(s) you'd like to notify of your counseling completion. If you'll be transferring schools, be sure to add those too.
- Learn What School Costs and How to Pay for It**
Understand what your education will cost and the options available to cover those costs, including borrowing federal student loans.
- Prepare for Successful Repayment**
Understand your repayment obligation and what it means to take out a federal student loan.
- Check Your Skills**
Review what you've learned with a few short knowledge checks.

Step 10: Select the institution you want to notify that you have completed entrance counseling. Our name may already appear automatically. If so, click **Add**.

Otherwise, go to the "Search for a school" tab. In the "Choose a State" field, write Puerto Rico for NUC University or Florida for Florida Technical College. Then, type the school: National University College

or Florida Technical College (as applicable) and click **Add**. At the bottom of the page, click **Continue**.

Step 11: After adding the school, click **Continue**.
