BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION WITH MAJOR IN FINANCE

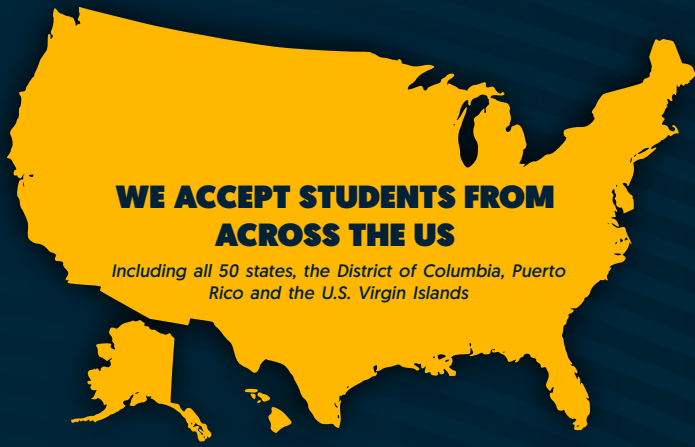
